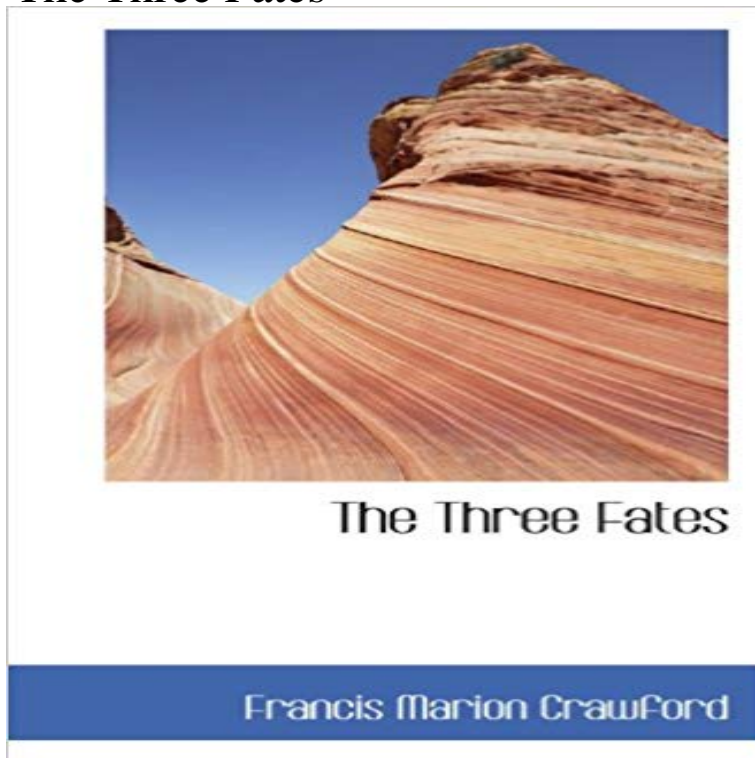


The Three Fates
